A Joint Resolution Declaring a Climate Emergency TOWN OF HARTFORD, TOWN OF HARTFORD SCHOOL DISTRICT

In the year 2019, the Town of Hartford and Town of Hartford School District jointly resolve as follows:

WHEREAS, a 2018 report from the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) states that in 2017 the planet had warmed by 1°C (1.8°F) above pre-industrial levels and is accelerating to reach 1.5°C (2.7°F) in 20 to 30 years; and

WHEREAS, the IPCC Report further states that to limit global temperature increase to 1.5°C (2.7°F), Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions from human activities must fall to 45% of 2010 levels by 2030; and

WHEREAS, the overwhelming scientific consensus that global warming results from human activities, primarily

- What? A comprehensive roadmap that outline the specific Strategies and Actions that reduce greenhouse gas emissions
- The CAP is anticipated to address Mitigation and Adaptation:



- Mitigation reducing the flow of heat-trapping greenhouse gases into the atmosphere (supporting goals of joint declaration).
- Adaptation developing ways to protect people and places by reducing their vulnerability to climate impacts (supporting guiding principals).
- Vulnerability Assessment >> Greenhouse Gas Inventory >> Renewable Energy Potential
- Goal: Present CAP to the Hartford Selectboard for review and comment in June 2021
